Welcome to Sacramento County!

The discovery of gold at Sutter's Mill capped off the greatest human migration in American history. Thousands of hopeful pioneers headed towards Mexican California on the Oregon Trail in search of a better life. From the settlement town of Old Sacramento, to the supply center and trade post of Sutter's Fort, the Sacramento region is rich in Gold Rush History.

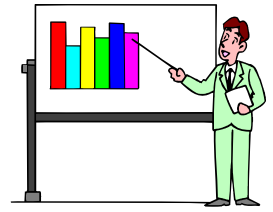
Old Sacramento: As you enter this 28-acre town of historic buildings constructed in the early 1800s, you'll step back in time to the California Gold Rush era. Pioneers first settled along the banks of the Sacramento River, a main traffic route for supplies. Regular flooding and subsequent disease made the early years difficult and implored the settlers to take on the ambitious task of raising the street level twelve feet. Today, after strong preservation efforts, the nostalgic appeal of early American history is reflected perfectly by the wooden sidewalks, horse-drawn carriages, old-fashioned candy shops and Mississippi-style riverboats. History comes to life through interactive experiences, such as taking a ride on a steam engine train, seeing what a one-roomed schoolhouse looked like, or dressing in period costumes for an old-fashioned photo.

Considering the adventurous and ambitious spirit inherent of the pioneers, it is no surprise that some famous names got their start in Sacramento. For example, the influence of the "Big Four" of western railroading (Leland Stanford, Mark Hopkins, Collis P. Huntington and Charles Crocker) is evident throughout the city. The Big Four Building in Old Sacramento includes the Huntington Hopkins Hardware Store Museum and Stanford Gallery. B.F. Hastings opened as a bank in April 1853 that is now a museum housing a reconstructed Supreme Court, Wells Fargo Bank and the Pony Express.

Long before the development of Old Sacramento, Native Americans populated the area. The Nisenan lived in the Sacramento valley for 10,000 years before any other settlers arrived. By 1833, however, a smallpox epidemic killed 20,000 Nisenan in the valley leaving the population vulnerable. And so, Sacramento's modern history actually begins in 1839 when Johann Augustus Sutter landed on the banks of the Sacramento River. He received a 48,000-acre land grant of Mexican California from Governor Alvarado of Mexico and built the adobe trading post known as Sutter's Fort. Sutter would trade with Indians, raise livestock and act as a representative of the Mexican government. When James Marshall discovered gold at Sutter's Mill, Sutter's Fort became invaluable to pioneers.

Designated "Tree City," with more trees lining its streets than any other metropolis in California, Sacramento is a natural choice for those putting down roots. Its approximate population is 400,018. Added to the recreation possibilities of the American River and a thriving cultural scene, it's no wonder that even today people feel they've struck gold when they discover Sacramento. As California's capitol city, Sacramento is center stage for governmental policy for the entire state.

...DEMOGRAPHICS

Population

Sacramento County is one of 58 counties in California. The county is in the Sacramento-Arden-Arcade metro area. The estimated population in 2008 was 1,352,445. This was an increase of 10.54% from the 2000 census. The actual city of Sacramento's population was estimated to be 445,335 in 2006.

Households

The median age in Sacramento was 38 in 2004 with the national average being 36. The male to female ratio was 47.0%/53.0% where the national average was 49.1%/50.9%.

Income

The median household income for 2004 was \$45,000, the national average was \$48,000. The 2009 projections are for the median income to be \$52,000 with the national average of \$56,000.

City Facts

Date of incorporation is 1849, registered as a charter city, and is approx. 99 square miles.

Sacramento is one of the West's fastest growing, most affordable, and attractive cities. Small town friendly with big city amenities, California's capitol city hosts more than 6 million visitors each year. Its mild climate is an ideal backdrop for enjoying one of City's many attractions, including world-class shopping, restaurants, golf courses, historic Old Sacramento, and The Sacramento Zoo. ...FAMILY OUTINGS

Historical sites and activities abound; from gold discovery park to the old trails used by early settlers.

California State Railroad Museum

111 I Street, Sacramento

This is the largest train museum in the country. Dedicated to accuracy and detail, the California State Railroad Museum, located in historic Old Sacramento, recreates the golden days of American railroading circa 1849. Adults and kids alike can wander for hours among restored locomotives, cars, bridges and railroad equipment. Indoor and outdoor displays bring to life rail travel during the Gold Rush Era. Admission for adults is USD3, and children under 16 are admitted free.

Sacramento Zoo

Home to more than 400 animals including the snow leopard, red panda, Bateleur eagles and reptiles. In addition to the animals, the Zoo has two lakes, and both a butterfly and hummingbird garden and a camellia garden complete with animal sculptures. The zoo offers lectures and tours. Services and amenities also include: picnic areas, concessions, gift store, stroller rentals and complimentary wheelchairs. Admission on weekdays is USD6.25 adults; USD4 children (3-12); children under three are admitted free. For weekend or holiday admission prices add 50 cents (USD) to weekday prices.

For a taste of the Old West, complete with dirt and cobblestone streets flanked with wide wooden sidewalks and "Bonanza"-style buildings, visit Old Sac. Tour the historical four blocks in a horse-drawn carriage or take a ride on a riverboat. Bustling with activity, this place offers tourist shops, museums and antique trains. On weekends you can usually hear Cajun, blues, or folk music in one of several saloons and restaurants.

Crocker Art Museum

Founded in the 1870s, this is known as the first art museum in the West. The historical building with hand-carved doors, ornate walls and parquet floors, creates a gorgeous backdrop as impressive as the art. The art includes the Gold Rush, Victorian and European masters and contemporary works. The museum hosts art talks, classical concerts, jazz concerts (the third Thursday of each month) and tours (afternoons and weekends). A gift shop is also available. Admission is USD6 for adults; USD3 students; children under six are admitted free.
